Spring is on the horizon, and that means one thing—it's almost time to ride!


Our Season Opener is set for May 9, and we can't wait to hit the road with old friends and new.



When the season wraps up, we will ask you to email your completed passport back to us.

At the year end BBQ, we'll recognize the **Top 3 Prairie Explorers with prizes** — and of course, plenty of stories, laughs, and bragging rights.

Spring Maintenance Basics | Title: Get Your Indian Motorcycle Ready for the Riding Season

Spring is prime time to give your motorcycle a thorough checkup before the first big ride of the year. This is a quick guide on best practices to ensure reliability and safety.

Maintenance Checklist

Fluids: Engine oil & filter | Coolant (if applicable) | Brake & clutch fluid levels

Tires: Check tread depth and signs of wear | Verify correct air pressure

Battery: Confirm battery charge and health, especially if it's been stored all winter

Chains & Belts (model-dependent): Inspect for slack or wear; lubricate chains if needed

Brakes & Controls: Inspect pads, rotors, brake lines; ensure throttle and clutch cables glide smoothly

Lighting: Confirm headlight, taillight, and turn signals are fully operational

QUICK TIPS: Ten Things All Car & Truck Drivers Should Know About Motorcycles

1. Over half of all fatal motorcycle crashes involve another vehicle. Most of the time, the car or truck driver, not the motorcyclist, is at fault. There are a lot more cars and trucks than motorcycles on the road, and some drivers don't "recognize" a motorcycle – they ignore it (usually unintentionally).
2. Because of its narrow profile, a motorcycle can be easily hidden in a car's blind spots (door/roof pillars) or masked by objects or backgrounds outside a car (bushes, fences, bridges, etc). Take an extra moment to look for motorcycles, whether you're changing lanes or turning at intersections.
3. Because of its small size, a motorcycle may look farther away than it is. It may also be difficult to judge a motorcycle's speed. When checking traffic to turn at an intersection or into (or out of) a driveway, predict a motorcycle is closer than it looks.
4. Motorcyclists often slow by downshifting or merely rolling off the throttle, thus not activating the brake light. Allow more following distance, say 3 or 4 seconds. At intersections, predict a motorcyclist may slow down without visual warning.
5. Motorcyclists often adjust position within a lane to be seen more easily and to minimize the effects of road debris, passing vehicles, and wind. Understand that motorcyclists adjust lane position for a purpose, not to be reckless or show off or to allow you to share the lane with them.
6. Turn signals on a motorcycle usually are not self-canceling, thus some riders (especially beginners) sometimes forget to turn them off after a turn or lane change. Make sure a motorcycle's signal is for real.
7. Maneuverability is one of a motorcycle's better characteristics, especially at slower speeds and with good road conditions, but don't expect a motorcyclist to always be able to dodge out of the way.
8. Stopping distance for motorcycles is nearly the same as for cars, but slippery pavement makes stopping quickly difficult. Allow more following distance behind a motorcycle because you can't always stop "on a dime."
9. When a motorcycle is in motion, see more than the motorcycle – see the person under the helmet, who could be your friend, neighbor, or relative.
10. If a driver crashes into a motorcyclist, bicyclist, or pedestrian and causes serious injury, the driver would likely never forgive himself/herself.



Left -
Extend the left arm straight out, with the palm facing down.




Right -
Extend the left arm out bending upward at a 90-degree angle, with the fist clenched.



Stop -
Extend the left arm and bend it downward at an angle of 90 degrees, with the fist clenched. The exact opposite of a right turn.



Speed Up -
Extend the left arm out with the palm facing upward, and do an upward swinging motion.



Slow Down -
Extend the left arm out with the palm facing downward, and do a downward swinging motion.



Follow Me -
Raise the left arm straight up with the palm facing forward. A quick swing of the palm in the forward direction can be done.



Hazard on the road -
If the hazard is on the left, point towards it with your left arm. If it's on the right, use your right foot to point towards it.



Single file -
Extend the left arm bending 90 degrees upward, with the index finger pointing towards the sky.



Double file -
Same as single file, except that two fingers (middle and index) should be raised.



Take the lead/Come -
Extend the left arm 45 degrees upward, palm faced forward pointing with the index finger, and swing the arm in an arc motion, moving from backward to forward.



Turn Indicator On -
Extend the left arm straight out, and do an open and close movement of the fist, with the fingers and thumb completely extended when opened.



Pull Over -
Extend the left arm 45 degrees upward, and do an inward swinging motion by bending it towards the shoulder.




Stop for Refreshment -
Move the thumb of the left hand towards the mouth, as if drinking from a bottle.



Stop for fuel -
Extend the arm out, and point with the index finger towards the petrol tank.
